May 23rd and the ECF will again give away bicycle helmets -- thanks



Our ECF fund holders are very generous in providing funding for the greater Emporia community through their Donor Advised and Field of Interest Funds. The ECF

manages many scholarship funds, which assist deserving students to further their education. The ECF manages selected grants using Board appointed Advisory Committees to review and assess applications for funding which benefits the community. And, the ECF sponsors the one day funding raising event - Match Day - benefitting 25 non-profit organizations. The

\$107,938.25 in scholarship awarded to 120 individuals. Match Day generated \$240,683.69 for 25 local non-profit organizations. In total, the ECF paid out \$1,763,559.84 in grants and scholarships. 2019 is off to a great start as total the ECF assets reached an all-time high of \$24,092,045 as of March 31st.
