# In the Spotlight



Newman Regional Health (NRH) is celebrating 100 years of service in 2022. When the NRH Foundation joined the ECF in December 2019, it became the largest fund in the community foundation.

Founded in 1922, Newman Memorial County Hospital was named in honor of a local businessman George W. Newman. He left a bequest of \$50,000 in his will specifically intended for the creation of a local hospital. Upon his death in February 1919, he provided an additional \$10,000 in an endowment. The total cost for building the hospital, with furnishings, was approximately \$300,000. Additional funds were raised through a two-year tax levy.

"I am sure that no one who lived in Emporia in 1922 ever imagined the changes in medicine and growth that would occur over the next 100 years," said Bob Wright, NRH CEO. "But here we are. More than 100 volunteers and 600 full and part-time employees providing essential services to our community in 350,000 square feet of buildings. There's no doubt that more changes are ahead, but if the COVID pandemic has taught us anything, it is that Emporia and NRH are up to the challenge."

## Investing in the Community

Representatives from UMB Bank presented the most recent quarterly report to the ECF Finance Committee on April 14th. While the report showed earnings were down for the year so far, UMB still expects to end 2022 with a positive number.

The next fund statement you receive will look different because of an exciting change in the ECF office. The ECF is transitioning from Bromelkamp's Community Pearl software to their newer offering: akoyaGo.

## "You Can Do It" (And She Did!)



For the last 12 years, Loni Heinen has served the ECF starting as a part-time employee and working her way up to the position of Financial Officer. Her skills and work

ethic were outstanding; however, she wanted more and that was a college degree. She had started higher education, but never completed it, so 2 ½ years ago she went back to complete her bachelor's degree. This May 14<sup>th</sup>, Loni will walk with other ESU graduates to accept her Bachelor of Science diploma.

Reaching her goal has not always been easy. In addition to her ECF position, she does the books for an Emporia business; is a member of the USD 284 School Board; was a 4-H leader; has a daughter going to K-State; is a "YaYa" to 7 grandkids; and managed to go fishing a few times with her husband Dave. When her goal seemed unattainable, Loni's cheerleaders would tell her "You can do it!"

Loni has decided to give back to others and has established the Loni Heinen "You Can Do It" Scholarship Legacy Fund which will provide scholarships to assist adults to finish their bachelor's degree or go towards a certificate program and increase their value as an employee. Because it's a Legacy Fund, Loni named the ECF as a beneficiary on a life insurance policy; however, when one ECF fund learned of the fund and its purpose, a very generous donation was made in Loni's honor. This donation (and others) will allow the "You Can Do It" Scholarship Legacy Fund to start awarding scholarships as early as next year.
