# Investing in the Community

After losing as much as \$5 million earlier this year, the ECF investments have made a strong comeback. The finance committee met with UMB Bank on October 15<sup>th</sup>

to hear the latest update. As of September 30<sup>th</sup>, the year-to-date return on investment was 3.52%. Overall, our investments at UMB continue to perform higher than their benchmarks. The



committee was told to expect volatility to continue in the coming months. We are excited to say that the ECF is currently over \$33 million as of the end of September, which is impressive with the effects COVID-19 has had on the markets and economy.

Scholarship season has finally ended and it was a busy time for the ECF. The ECF funds awarded \$116,000 to 143 students this year.

The Greater Emporia Area Disaster Relief Fund, a collaboration between the ECF, Emporia Main Street, KVOE and the United Way of the Flint Hills, has raised \$200,000 since being established in April. To date, \$180,000 has been granted to businesses and nonprofits adversely affected by COVID-19.
